in Yamanouchi Town

Burnable Garbage



Use designated garbage bags.
Drain food waste well.

- Food waste**
 - *Drain well.
 - *Try to compost food waste.
 - Subsidies are available for purchasing home-use garbage disposal units.
- Scrap Paper** (non-recyclable types)
- Plastic goods without the ♻️ mark**

- Paper diapers**
 - *Dispose of excrement first
- Small wooden goods/wooden boxes**
- Leather goods**
- Cassettes/CDs**
- Cloth goods**
 - *Not including clothing
- Ski boots**

- Aluminum foil**
- Others**
 - Shells/bones/tea bags/cigarette butts
- Bedclothes/carpets/rugs**
 - *Electric carpets are **metal trash**

Things to tie in bundles and put out

- Boards, tree trimmings**
 - Tree branches less than 12cm in diameter
 - Within 30cm
 - Within 50cm
- *Please cut up anything larger than this before putting it out, or bring it directly to Higashiyama Clean Center (for a fee)

Plastic Packages



Use designated garbage bags.
Put in packages that have been washed clean of oils.

- Applies to containers and packages with this mark.
- Wash clean**
- Do not double bag**
- Bottles**
 - Shampoo
 - Detergent
 - Bottles for yogurt drinks, etc.
 - *Not including PET bottles with ♻️ mark

- Trays**
 - Trays for fresh meat/fish products
 - Trays for ready-made foods
 - *Not including white Styrofoam trays
- Cups/Packages**
 - Pudding cups, egg packages, convenience store bento containers and ready-made food packages

- Caps and labels**
 - Plastic caps and labels from bottles and PET bottles
- Plastic Bags**
 - Shopping bags, packaging such as snack food bags
- Package cushioning**
 - Styrofoam package cushioning and bubble wrap

- Tubes, small bags, boil-in-the-bag pouches, natto packages, etc.**
- that are dirty (unwashed) are burnable garbage

Metals



Use designated garbage bags.

- Aluminum cans**
- Steel cans**
- Spray cans**
 - *Use contents up completely and put a hole in it as required.
- Kitchenware**
 - Metal/Aluminum/Enamel

- Metal Toys**
 - Batteries are **hazardous waste**
- Electric kettles/Thermos bottles**

- Umbrellas**
 - Cloth and nylon parts are **burnable garbage**
- Knives/Kitchen knives**
 - *Wrap in paper and label contents so they aren't a danger
- Electrical cords**

- Things to tie in bundles and put out**
- Electric blankets**
- Electric carpets**
- Irons**
- Toaster ovens**

Paper



Use designated garbage bags.

- Beverage cartons**
 - *Those with a silver-colored lining are **burnable garbage**
 - Slit open, wash, and dry them
- Cardboard**
 - The type with the wavy core
 - Tie with string in a cross shape
 - *Try to use drop off points at supermarkets, too

- Newspapers**
- Magazines**
 - Magazines, books, flyers, thick paper, wrapping paper, copier paper, paper boxes

- Miscellaneous paper**
 - Small slips of paper
 - Put them in a paper bag and tie with string so contents don't spill out
 - *Tubes from plastic wrap are **burnable garbage**

- Caution**
 - Paper cups, carbon paper, oil paper, envelopes with glue on them, crimped postcards, and anything with parts that aren't paper (prohibited items) are **burnable garbage**

Landfill Garbage



Use designated garbage bags.


- Tea cups and ceramics**
- Glassware and glass sheets**
 - *Wrap broken glass in paper and label contents
- Heat-resistant bottles/glassware**
- Vases**
- Flower pots**
- PVC products**
- Ash from cooking or heating**
 - *Bag it after being sure it is extinguished
- Disposable lighters**
 - *Use contents completely before disposal
- LED lights** (Label as LED)

- Hazardous Waste**
 - 2 times a year (Around June and November)
 - Dry cell batteries
 - Button batteries
 - Coin batteries
 - Small rechargeable batteries
 - Fluorescent lights
 - Put them out in the box they came in
 - *LED lights go in **Landfill Garbage**
 - Mercury Thermometers
 - *Digital thermometers are **Burnable Garbage**
 - Glow lamps
 - Light bulbs
 - *LED lights go in **Landfill Garbage**
 - Mirrors
 - *Remove the outer frame

- Bulky Waste**
 - 2 times a year (Around July and November)
 - Furniture
 - Electric stoves and fan heaters
 - Bicycles
 - Stereo components
 - Microwaves
 - Pianos (organs)
 - Bathtubs
 - Ski sets/snowboard sets
 - Bedding
 - Beds/Mattresses, etc.
 - Home appliances
 - Electric fans, speakers, vacuums, electric carpets, etc.
 - Kitchenware
 - Dish washers, kitchen counters, water heaters, ovens, hot plates, etc.
 - Others
 - Tricycles, wheelbarrows, sewing machines, motorcycles, tires, brush cutters, etc.

- Please put these out for the special collection 2 times a year, or bring directly to Higashiyama Clean Center

Bottles



Try returning the following to the store

- Caps/Lids go in **Plastic Packages** or **Burnable Garbage**.
- Metal caps go in **Metals**
- Remove plastic labels and dispose with **plastics**
- Paper labels can be left on for disposal
- Wash clean
- Put out with same color glass
- Broken bottles also go with same color glass
- *Heat-resistant glassware goes in **Landfill Garbage**
- Sake bottles
- Beer bottles
- Milk bottles


Plastic bottles (PET)



1 Check for the ♻️ mark

- 2 Remove caps (lids) and labels. (Caps and labels go in ♻️)
- 3 Rinse the inside lightly.
- 4 Crush as best as possible.
- 5 Put in the net at the garbage disposal area

White Trays (Styrofoam)



Wash clean

- Put in the bag at the garbage disposal area
- *Try to use drop off points at supermarkets, too
- ★ Does not apply to trays that aren't Styrofoam, colored trays, and natto packages (Put in ♻️ or in **Burnable Garbage**)


Used Cooking Oil



Put in the special container at the garbage disposal area

- Take the container you used to bring the used cooking oil in home
- *Absolutely do not put mechanical oils such as engine oil in the special container

Clothing



How to dispose

- Put it in the bag at the garbage disposal area. Or put it out in a clear plastic bag (so contents are visible)
- ◆ **Applicable items**
 - Clothing that has been washed, isn't dirty or smelly, and can be reused
 - Shirts, sweatshirts, sweaters, pants, skirts, suits, etc.
 - *Does not apply to clothing that is ripped, dirty, or has holes in it, sheets, bedding, curtains, or other non-clothing cloth items

The following appliances are recycled by the makers by law

- Air conditioners**
 - TVs**
 - Refrigerators/freezers**
 - Washers/dryers**
 - Computers**
 - Small home appliances**
- How to proceed
- 1 Contact the maker directly by phone or website about collection and dispose of it in the designated manner.
 - 2 Have it collected by a courier service (See small home appliances)

- **Paint and chemicals**
 - **Waste oil (except cooking oil)**
 - **Things that could be considered industrial waste (Farm/construction materials)**
 - **Home medical waste such as syringes and needles**
 - **LP gas cylinders**
 - **Agrichemical, poison, and insecticide bottles**
 - **Extinguishers**

- For a fee**

 - 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. on Mon to Fri
 - (Burnables that need crushing until 3:00 p.m.)
 - 8:30 a.m. – noon on Sat
 - (Burnables that need crushing until 11:00 a.m.)
 - *Except Sunday or holidays, and Dec 30 to Jan 3
